Taking as a case study the Syrian refugees
Zaatari camp in Jordan, this presentation
illustrates the processes of adaptations and
transformations that have taken place
between 2012 and 2019, as initiated
collectively by the residents of the camp. It
illustrates how in situations of social stress,
collective initiatives empower refugees to
customize and adapt their environment,
expand opportunities of income generating
activities and social interaction and to
thereby allow them to find dignity, meaning,
and create a sense of place form a non-place.
